

Hateley Heath Primary School Sport Premium Report 2018 - 2019

The Government provides additional funding to schools to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport.

In the academic year 2018/19 Hateley Heath received £19,494. This funding was used to implement various actions to improve and further develop the quality of PE and sport provision across the school. This also included employing the services of North Birmingham Futsal Partnership sports coaches, who have been working with us since September 2018.

With the support of North Birmingham Futsal Partnership's qualified sports coaches and our staff, the key objectives of spending the PE grant were to:

- Offer an inspired curriculum in PE;
- Increase the health and fitness opportunities for our pupils in school;
- Enhance opportunities for Breakfast clubs and After-School provision;
- Improve resources to support the teaching of PE;
- Broaden the sporting opportunity available to pupils, including SEND events;
- Instil in pupils a love of sort and physical activity;
- Provide all children with the opportunity to lead healthy, active lives.

Hire of Sports coach to teach Physical Education and provide lunch time and after school clubs to children.	£10,920.00	In order to improve the teaching of physical education across Hateley Heath, a sports coach has been hired to deliver PE sessions across early years, KS1 and KS2.
		To maximise the impact, teachers and LSPs are present during lessons to develop their own confidence and to gain ideas. Teachers are also able to team teach along with the sports coach to increase their confidence.
		The use of sports coaches means children are being exposed to better skilled practise of sports as sports coaches hold specific sports qualifications. From observations it is also evident that children are more engaged with the variety of activities that sports coaches plan.

After School Clubs for targeted children across the school.	£2,370	The sports coach at Hateley Heath provide after school clubs for both key stage one and key stage two. Targeted children are offered a place before others to increase their activeness and participation in sports. Sports sessions after school encourage children
		to take part in more sports activities in their free time. As the sessions are very engaging for children, these are used as a reward for target children to encourage them to have a more active role within physical education.
Hire of current LSPs as outdoor learning and physical education practitioners.	1 staff member x focused physical activity sessions every afternoon. £6,250.00	Children across the school have targeted physical and relaxing sessions on a weekly basis to increase their confidence and raise attainment during their physical education lessons as well as during the whole school day. In order to target and address lower achieving children in Physical Education, a staff member at Hateley Heath Primary has completed the Relax Kids Course. Children across the school have targeted physical and relaxing sessions on a weekly basis to increase their confidence and raise attainment during their physical education lessons as well as during the whole school day. To maximise the impact, children having the sessions are changed on a termly basis to ensure more children are exposed to the techniques. Children are then assessed and new children are chosen if necessary.
Extra-Curricular Clubs	NA	A variety of sports clubs including Basketball, Team Games, Street Dancing and Dance take place at Hateley Heath Primary to promote

		 physical activity within and outside of school time. Children take part in competitions and perform at the end of each term. They are rewarded at the end of the year for their efforts. Through seeing performances and hearing about competitions, more and more children are showing an interest towards voluntarily attending extra-curricular clubs.
Supply Cover	£390.00	Supply cover was arranged on two occasions so that the sports lead could create updated curriculum overviews for the physical education curriculum. Informal interviews were carried out with children to gain their opinions on what engages them in physical education and what can be done to further engage them. The physical education curriculum was then updated. Two afternoons were used to observe physical education sessions by the sports coaches and the other half was used to collect pupils' voice about the current physical education curriculum. Feedback was then given to both the sports coach and the class teacher to enable them to alter their teaching style to provide a better sports experience to children.
Inspection/Equipment Check Cost	£343.00	An inspection was carried out on all sports equipment to ensure that all sports equipment and environments are safe for children to use.
